How do mentees complete the programme

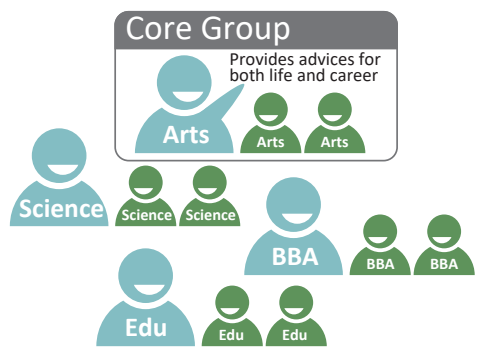
1. Help maintain a good relationship among the Base Group. If you are a senior student, take care of your junior schoolmates and share your experiences.
2. Proactively organize an activity (or an online meeting) and invite your groupmates to join. You also need to write a report.
3. Actively participate in the activities offered by the programme.
4. Be punctual all the time.
5. Observe the commitments you have made to the programme.

7 Important points for the programme

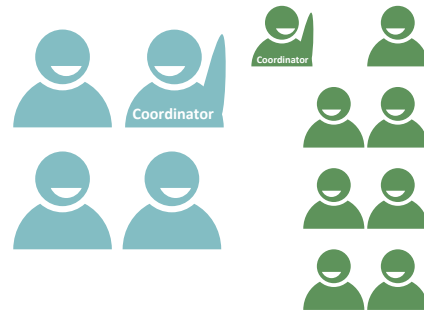
Base Group



Core Groups are assigned according to the expertise of mentors, majors, preferences of mentees; and also interests of them. They are then formed into a Base Group.

Group Coordinator

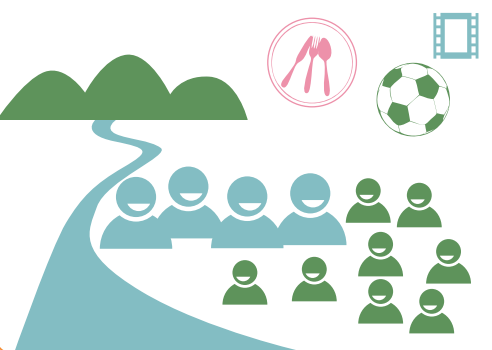
Important!



Both mentors and mentees would elect a coordinator. The coordinators would help in encouraging groupmates to participate in various activities.

Organize Activities

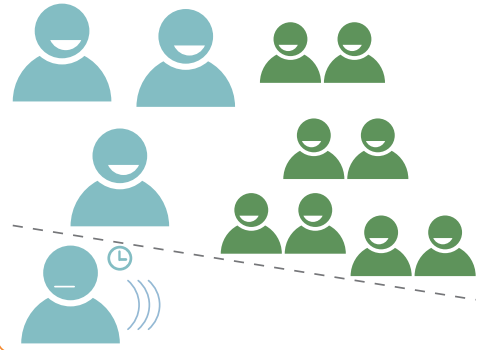
Please submit a Written report to the College.



Both Base and Core groups would organize various activities. Any kinds of activity are welcome.

Teamwork

Important!



If a mentor is busy, other mentors would take care of his/her mentees.

Constantly contact



The coordinators should constantly maintain communications among the group. They can help in contacting groupmates for gatherings. When the coordinators are not available, other members should help.

Communicate electronically



It is basic etiquette for mentees to reply promptly to mentors when they receive advices or invitations. If the mentees find it is not possible to reply immediately, they should also let the mentors know they are taking time to reply.

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Features

1. Strong alumni network of different careers

Mentors of this programme include alumni graduated from 60s to 2010s. Whether you are students or alumni, you will be benefited.

2. Matching for Base and Core Groups

Small groups are matched according to the mutual career and personal interests, backgrounds and programme expectations. A Base Group is formed for 4 Core Groups to expand discipline diversity.

3. Mentor Expertise Network

A list of "Mentor Expertise" would be sent to participants. The list includes the names, majors, and recent occupation (the latest one for retired mentors). Participants will know who is participating in the programme and they can approach each other by asking the College.

4. Common Interest Newtork

A list of "Common Interest" would be sent to participants. Participants can find friends with the same interest among all people in the programme.

5. College and Alumni Association activity recommendation

The College would send out activity recommendations from time to time. Groups can consider attending the activities.

6. International students are welcome

We welcome international students to participate. We hope to promote cultural exchange in this programme.

7. Career Apprenticeship Scheme

To provide experienced leaders in different industries to lead our Mentees (year 2 or above) and bring them to become a well-equipped person to take the challenges in their careers.

Assessment



We recommended setting aside about 1 hour each month or around 8 hours over the year for mentor-mentee interaction (including e-communication, We recommend exploring and discussing on an issue of any topic.)



Mentees must meet their mentors at least twice during the period.



Mentees must attend one session of the Career Talks Day to be held on 20 January 2024 (For non-local students who do not understand Cantonese, we will provide English interpretation.).



Mentees must take initiative to organize a gathering for your groupmate (you may co-organize with your Base Group.) For example, pay a visit to a museum.



Mentees must write a report of no more than 200 words for the aforementioned self-initiated-activity. It must also include at least one photo taken during the activity. Each mentee MUST submit individual report. An alternative is to submit a "Self-reflection report".



You would be assessed by your mentors. Mentees must receive a rating of "Fair" or above in order to complete the Programme.

Upon the fulfilment of the above requirements, you would be awarded a "Participation certificate". For those who participate proactively in the programme may be awarded a "Certificate of Excellent" and also book coupons.
