

Student Exchange Program
between
Yale University and New Asia College (YUNA) 2024-25

1. History

New Asia College and Yale University have been jointly organizing this short-term annual student exchange program since 1993. Every year, the two institutions agree on a theme for exchange. The themes over the years are as follows:

2. Objectives

- i. To enable students to get a deeper understanding of the social, cultural and scientific issues of the two regions, so as to widen their intellectual horizons.
- ii. To enable students to acquire a better understanding of the public affairs and problems in Hong Kong and the United States through comparisons.
- iii. To strengthen the academic ties between the two institutions.
- iv. To build lifelong friendships between participants of the two institutions.

3. Theme

Both institutions agree on a common theme for exchange each year and a variety of issues related to the theme will be examined. The theme for 2024-25 exchange is “**Reimagining Cities: Hong Kong and New Haven**”.

4. Period of Visit

New Asia students will pay a 14-day visit to Yale during Lunar New Year period in 2025. Yale group will pay a reciprocal visit to Hong Kong in March 2025.

5. Formation of New Asia Visiting Team

- i. The team will tentatively consist of eight students and one faculty who acts as academic advisor of the team.
- ii. Selected students are expected to:
 - a. be a full-time undergraduate of the College;
 - b. have good command of English language;
 - c. have reasonably good academic performance;
 - d. have some experience and organizing ability in extracurricular activities;
 - e. be interested in and have knowledge of the theme;
 - f. should have good understanding of the theme in both Hong Kong and the Mainland, and from a global perspective.

6. *Responsibility of Student Participants*

- i. Student participants are responsible for conducting research on the selected issues in teams and preparing oral and written reports on it, under consultation with the faculty advisor. They will present their findings in an academic symposium during their visit to Yale. Intellectual curiosity is key in enhancing cross-cultural understanding.
- ii. Student participants, as a team, are responsible for planning and organizing a symposium and a series of theme-related visits and cultural activities for the Yale visitors in March 2025. A strong ability to plan and execute and a will to take initiative are essential.
- iii. Student participants are expected to demonstrate a high level of commitment and engagement to the program, at least in terms of attendance of weekly preparatory meetings, the March program and various program-related activities.

7. *Expenses*

Yale University provides board and lodging in the U.S. Each student will pay HK\$5,000 for part of the airfare. The College will cover the remaining balance and travel insurance. Personal expenses in the U.S. will be borne by the student participants.
